Due to the Foundation's growing support, we were able to welcome 3 new pupils to our successful scholarship program, increasing our number of beneficiaries to 9 for the 2018 year.

Two of our new pupils stem from Paul Greyling Primary School, a Fish Hoek based school that has been part of the Foundation's bursaries and individual support program since 2010. Together with Paul Greyling Primary School, we've sponsored 19 learners from Vrygrond and Ocean View to attend the school.
