

Investor Profile

The Fund-of-Funds (FoF) is suitable for individuals, charities, trusts, companies and family networks that have discretionary funds to invest, with a long-term investment horizon. The FoF invests 3rd party managers. The FoF does not have income provision as a primary objective and is subject to currency risk. The FoF is not suitable for retirement funding purposes as a stand-alone option.



Investment Objective and Strategy

The FoF aims to achieve a total return in excess of SA inflation +5% per annum over the longer-term, while actively managing the risk attached to the portfolio.

The FoF will invest in a diversified mix of worldwide assets in the form of collective investment schemes managed by external managers investing in equities, bonds, property, cash, preference shares and other instruments as determined by the Authority from time to time that conform with the Fund objectives.

The FoF will be positioned according to the portfolio manager's assessment as to prevailing investment prospects of each asset class and existing, as well as potential, underlying assets. When deemed appropriate, the FoF may invest in offshore assets up to a maximum of 100% of the portfolio.



Value of R100 invested at inception, income reinvested, NAV-NAV





The Fund's **Total Expense Ratio (TER)** reflects the percentage of the average Net Asset Value (NAV) of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. **Transaction Costs (TC)** is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. The **Total Investment Charge (TIC)** should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager.

Specific risks that may apply to the fund

Default risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments (e.g. bonds) may not be able to meet interest payments, nor repay the money they have borrowed. Performance has been calculated using net NAV to NAV numbers with income reinvested. The performance for each period shown reflects the return for investors who have been fully invested for that period. Glossary

Annualised performance:

An annualized total return is the geometric average amount of money earned by an investment each year over a given time period. It is calculated as a geometric average to show what an investor would earn over a period of time if the annual return was compounded.

NAV:

The Net Asset Value (NAV) represents the assets of the Fund less its liabilities.

Highest / Lowest 1 year return:

These figures represent the highest and lowest rolling 12-month returns on each unit class of the Fund since inception.

Higher Risk Portfolios:

Generally, these portfolios hold more equity and offshore exposure than either lower or medium risk portfolios and therefore tend to exhibit higher variability in returns (volatility). While expected returns could be higher than lower or medium risk portfolios, the potential loss of capital could also be higher.

Funds of Funds (FoF):

A FoF is an investment strategy that holds a portfolio of 3rd party investment funds, as opposed to investing directly into stocks, bonds or other listed securities. This type of investing is often referred to as multi-manager investing.

Manager activity during the quarter

After trading out of SA bond exposure at the beginning of the quarter for tax efficiency purposes, the position was re-established via allocation to the Coronation Bond Fund. The Satrix Global Infrastructure Fund was sold and global property exposure (Sygnia Itrix Global Property ETF) was reduced as valuations reflected lower rate expectations. Proceeds were allocated to ZAR cash.

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

Contributions to FoF quarterly return

Domestic policy developments in the form of a lower inflation target to be followed, an improved fiscal and terms-of-trade position as well as a stronger ZAR provided continued tailwinds for SA bonds. SA equities continued to rise, largely due to precious metals, over the quarter with broader returns across larger and smaller capitalisation stocks. Global managers lagged as gains were wiped out by a stronger rand. Additionally, emerging market equities began to cool after a strong run.

Changes in asset allocation

Exposure to risk assets (Equity, Property, & Preference) was reduced (reduction in global real estate and global infrastructure) as well as being allowed to drift a little lower on capital injections from investors. Offshore exposure was thus moderated as a result. We are quietly confident that the level of dry powder at our disposal has not only increased in value at current market levels but affords a flexibility when assessing future opportunities.

A note on portfolio risk

Drawdown measures the peak-to-trough decline during a specific period, quoted as a percentage between the latest peak and subsequent trough of the FoF, before a new peak is achieved. It is instructive when measuring the loss to the portfolio during a period and the subsequent return required to return to the previous peak of the portfolio. The drawdown profile shown alongside depicts the increased volatility being experienced in risk markets over the past 5 years. Asset allocation intervention during such periods is necessary to compress the recovery time factor and/or limit further downside. The appropriate period over which to measure performance of the FoF is rolling 5-year periods, given the risk profile and recommended holding period. Shorter measurement periods are linked to a higher variance in returns (see table below left).

Adherence to Fund Policy Objective

The FoF has adhered to its Policy Objective, as stated in the Supplemental Deed, in all respects during the quarter. There are no unresolved breaches to report from prior periods.
