## RISK PROFILE

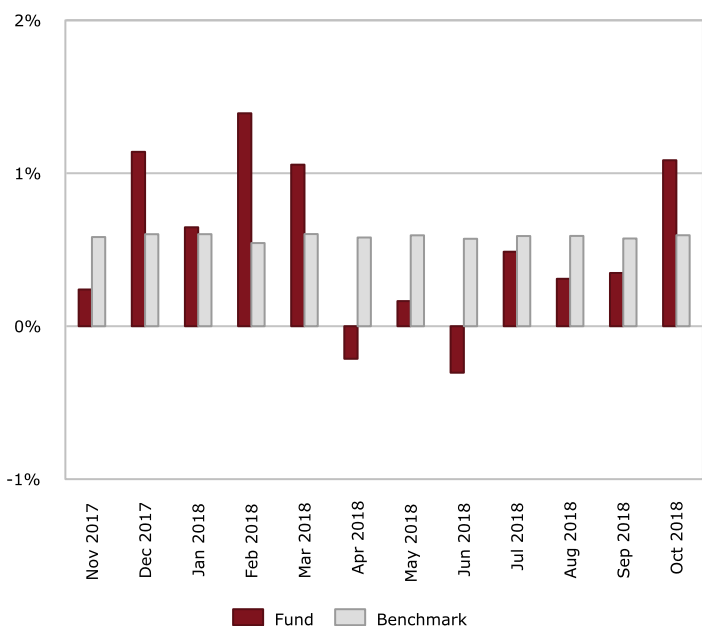

The probability of losses are less than high risk portfolios with direct market exposure. Expected potential long term investment returns could therefore be lower than high risk portfolios due to lower market exposure.

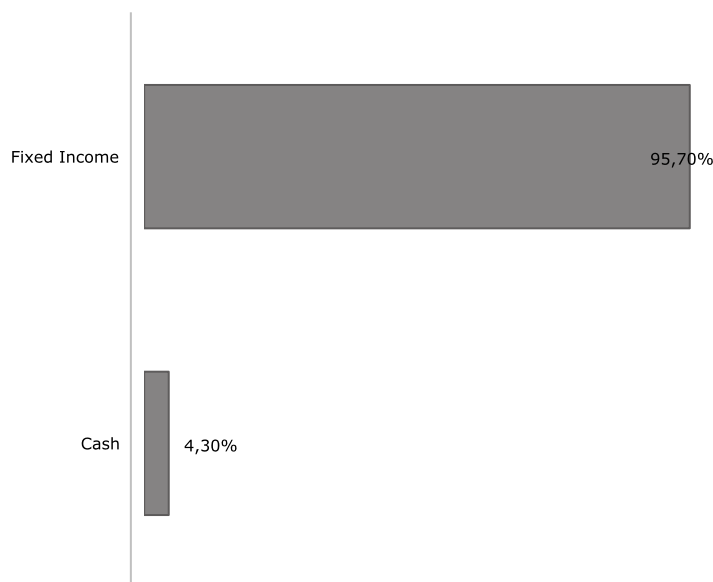
## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND SUMMARY

The 27Four Alternative Income Prescient QI Fund of Hedge Funds is an optimal blend of South African fixed income and structured credit hedge funds exploiting relative value and credit arbitrage opportunities in the listed credit space. The fund has a moderate to low risk profile and is designed to deliver consistent positive risk-adjusted returns, independent of the direction of the market. The fund will seek to capitalise on all investment opportunities across all asset classes and sectors within South Africa. The fund will have maximum flexibility to invest in underlying hedge funds which in turn invest in a wide range of instruments including, but not limited to, equities, money market instruments, debentures, options, warrants, convertible debt securities, debt instruments, repurchase agreements, futures and any other listed and unlisted financial instrument in line with conditions as determined by legislation from time to time. The fund will employ a VAR approach to measure exposure.

<b>Annualised Performance:</b>	Annualised performance show longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.
<b>Best Month:</b>	Largest increase in any single month.
<b>Highest &amp; Lowest Return:</b>	The highest and lowest returns over any 1 year period since the inception date.
<b>Max Drawdown:</b>	The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.
<b>NAV:</b>	The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.
<b>Sharpe Ratio:</b>	The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.
<b>Standard Deviation:</b>	The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.
<b>Tracking Error:</b>	The volatility of the difference in returns between a Fund and its Benchmark. Also known as active risk.
<b>% Positive Months:</b>	The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

## FUND SPECIFIC RISKS

<b>Currency exchange risk:</b>	Changes in the relative values of individual currencies may adversely affect the value of investments and any related income.
<b>Default risk:</b>	The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments (e.g. bonds) may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
