INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund is priced in Rands and aims to outperform G7 inflation in Euro terms over time while aiming to limit capital losses.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund invests in money market instruments, capital market instruments and equities with an active asset allocation overlay. The equity component of the Fund is always protected. As the underlying Fund is priced in Euro's the exchange rate volatility between Euro's and Rands are reflected in the price. The feeder fund is invested wholly in the Prescient Global Positive Return Fund.

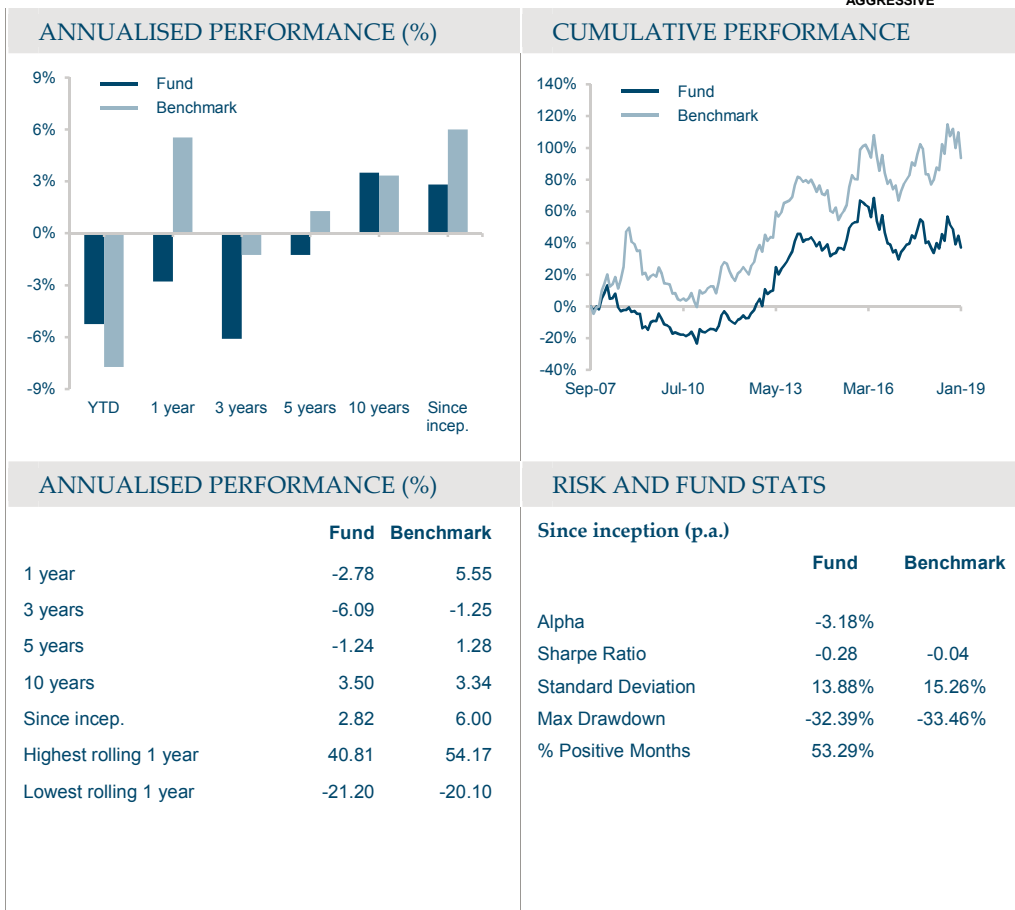
WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking a hedge against any Rand depreciation while gaining exposure to a risk aware asset allocation offshore fund. This Fund is suitable to investors with a medium to long-term investment horizon.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios typically exhibit more volatility and potential for capital losses due to higher exposure to equities and exposure to offshore markets where currency fluctuations may result in capital losses. These portfolios typically target returns in the region of 5% - 6% above inflation over the long term.

FUND COMMENTARY

The recovery in risky assets that began in December 2018 continued apace in January. Fears of excessive monetary policy tightening by the US Federal Reserve have receded as the central bank turned more dovish in its latest Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting. Benign inflationary pressures have afforded the policymakers some room to pause rate hikes while they assess the impact of their recent hikes on financial markets and the broader real economy. The bank's FOMC signalled flexibility with regards to future path of the fed funds rate and, most notably, the reduction of the size of the balance sheet. Interestingly, Fed Fund futures are now pricing in policy rate cuts in 2020. A gentler tone by the Fed, coupled with optimism around US/China trade negotiations triggered some risk seeking behaviour by market participants as the two biggest overhangs to risk sentiment in 2018 seem to have dissipated. Locally, the South African Reserve Bank's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) kept the repo rate on hold (currently 6.75%) in a unanimous vote as the stronger Rand and weaker oil price improved the inflation outlook. The MPC also lowered their inflation forecast for 2019 by 70 basis points to 4.8% (previously 5.5%). Taken together with the dovish tone of the statement in general, further rate hikes appear to be less of a possibility in the near term. Focus will now turn to President Ramaphosa's State of Nation Address and Minister Mboweni's budget speech as we continue searching for clues regarding the momentum and political will behind implementation of structural policy reforms that will see South Africa escape the low growth trap it finds itself in.

Contributors to performance: January saw a broad-based recovery in risky assets. Our positioning in global emerging market bonds, short duration credit and global equities contributed strongly to performance.

Detractor from performance: The cost of protection against downside equity market movement detracted from performance.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance show longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
