The Fund is Section 65 approved and is suitable for investors with a long term time horizon that are able to withstand higher than average volatility in the price of the fund over shorter time periods.


Investment Strategy

The fund is an actively managed, concentrated portfolio of global equities that aims to outperform the MSCI All Country World Index (ACWI) over the long term. The Fund invests in company shares, selected bottom-up based on fundamental research and valuation and is fully invested at all times.

Monthly Commentar

Global equity markets delivered tepid returns in November. Share prices sagged then rallied as investor concerns over valuations initially came to the fore but were then assuaged by resilient corporate earnings reports and ongoing strong momentum in the outlook for Al-sensitive sectors. The macroeconomic backdrop stabilised during the period as the US government shutdown ended and inflation fears receded somewhat. Dampened expectations for a December rate cut by the US Federal Reserve came back into focus towards month end which buoyed markets.

Against this mixed backdrop, the fund performed well and in line with expectations, beating the MSCI ACWI index for the month and building on the strong gains achieved for the year to date.

Noteworthy contributors to fund outperformance included some long-held core and fairly defensive shares like AstraZeneca, Eli Lilly, Anglogold and Johnson & Johnson, while Broadcom (one of key and similarly longstanding holdings) handsomely outperformed Al-peer Nvidia as news broke of increasing support for Broadcom's custom Al chip. Detractors included some recent strong gainers like Prosus, Siemens AG and defence industrials, positions that we still view positively.

Total Expense Ratio (TER)
