INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The investment objective of the Feeder Fund is to achieve capital appreciation over the long term. The Feeder Fund aims to achieve this investment objective through obtaining exposure to the Underlying Fund (Omba Global Equity Fund, sub-fund of the Omba Investments ICAV), a DIVERSIFIED portfolio consisting primarily of GLOBAL equities and equity-related securities.

The Underlying Fund is permitted to invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments in line with the Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) regulations and Underlying Fund supplemental documents determined by legislation or amendment thereof from time to time.




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COUNTRY BREAKDOWN (TOP 10)




MARKET COMMENTARY

December and Q4 were a great epilogue to 2023 for equity and bond investors alike. The Q4 rally was driven by swiftly adjusting interest rate expectations which were supported by the increased probability of a soft-landing - meaning lower interest rates, falling inflation and reasonable growth. Q4 accounted for roughly half the yearly performance of global equity markets (MSCI ACWI, +4.8% MoM, +11.1% QoQ, +22.8% YTD). In bond markets, US 10Y yields fell by 70.7bps QoQ (-47.4bps MoM) to just below 3.9%, finishing 2023 roughly flat after peaking at close to 5% in October 2023. US inflation (CPI November 2023, +3.1% YoY) is approaching the 2% target after dropping from its peak of 9.1% in June 2022. Shelter (+6.5% YoY) is the last major component of the inflation basket driving "abnormal" price increases. However, observed rental data across the US suggest shelter cost growth is hovering around the 2016-2019 average of 3%. This indicates inflation may subside in 2024 to the broader inflation target of 2%, ceteris paribus. Lower yields benefitted global bond markets (iShares Global Corp Bond ETF, +4.2% MoM, +9.0% QoQ) and especially long duration bonds (iShares \$ Treasury Bond 20+yr UCITS ETF, +8.6% MoM, +12.9% QoQ). Gold (LBMA Gold, +1.4% MoM, +11.2% QoQ) also rose as a result. US blue chips (S&P 500, +4.5% MoM, +11.7% QoQ), tech stocks (Nasdaq 100, +5.6% MoM, +14.6% QoQ) and especially small caps (SPDR Russell 2000 UCITS ETF, +13.7% MoM +15.1% QoQ) led global

indices. Small cap outperformance was a welcome sight, showcasing broader participation in equity performance, compared to the previously narrow market led by the "Magnificent 7". S&P 500 Equal Weight (+6.9% MoM, +11.9% QoQ) also caught up with its market cap sibling, confirming a healthier bull market. European equities (Stoxx 600, +3.8% MoM, +6.8% QoQ) were somewhat softer but US Dollar weakened (EURUSD, +4.3% QoQ). UK equities (FTSE 100, +3.9% MoM, +2.3% QoQ) lagged, driven by ailing commodity (S&P GSCI, -3.6% MoM, -12.1% QoQ) and oil prices (Brent 1st month, -7.0% MoM, -19.2% QoQ). Slower GDP growth (Q3 2023, +4.9% YoY) and often hostile regulatory policy on both sides of the Pacific, made China (CSI 300, -1.8% MoM, -6.8% QoQ) the only major market to finish 2023 lower. It remains to be seen how long markets can remain uninterested in attractive valuations and reasonable cash flows. Other emerging markets such as India (Nifty 50, +7.9% MoM, +10.9% QoQ), Brazil (Bovespa, +5.4% MoM, +15.1% QoQ) and Korea (KOSPI, +7.4% MoM, +11.0% QoQ) performed in line with developed counterparties, lifted by risk-on sentiment. Japan (Nikkei 225, +0.1% MoM, +5.2% QoQ, +31% YTD) was another strong performer, while Japanese Yen (USDJPY, -5.7% QoQ) touched the 140/USD level as the carry trade becomes less attractive with lower global (ex-Japan) yields. We urge caution given the magnitude of the current rally and low volatility (VIX trading around 5Y lows). We have consequently reduced equity exposure in late December to realise recent gains but also to position portfolios more defensively, remain nimble and take advantage of potential spikes in volatility.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Annualised Return	Annualised return is a measure which rescales returns, for periods greater than one year, to a 12-month geometric average return.
Dividend Yield	The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.
Best/Worst 12 Months	Respectively, the maximum and minimum % change in NAV Per Share over a 12-month period using daily performance data.
NAV Per Share	Net Asset Value (NAV) Per Share represents the total market value of the portfolio less liabilities and divided by the number of outstanding shares.
Positive / Negative Month(s)	A month is positive (negative) if the NAV Per Share, of a specific share class, increases (decreases) in value from the last day of the previous month to the last day of the following month.
Risk Indicator	The risk indicator for the Fund is set at 6 as this reflects the market risk arising from the proposed investments. The risk indicator is determined using historical data or, where historical data is not available, using simulated historical data. Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The risk category shown is not a target or a guarantee and may change over time. A category 1 fund is not risk free, the risk of loss is small but the chance of making gains may also be limited. During the phase in period TERs do not include information gathered over a full year. Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the funds underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fun and impacts Fund returns. It should be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.
