The Steyn Capital Global Emerging Markets Fund is a value orientated long only portfolio with a bottom-up stock selection approach, predominantly investing in listed equities in Emerging and Frontier markets.

Objectives & Strategy

The fund's primary objective is to provide a high level of return over the long term while minimizing the risk of capital impairment. The investment strategy is to maximize investor capital by buying securities with trading values materially lower than their intrinsic values.

Monthly Commentary by Investment Manager

The Steyn Capital Global Emerging Markets fund returned 1.73% for the month of December. The largest contributors to monthly performance included a Precious Metals holding, which traded up alongside strong gold prices, as well as Taiwanese and Korean semiconductor companies, which traded up on consensus upgrades.

At month end, the fund held 40 positions, comprising 97% equity exposure.

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2025 Annual Commentary by Investment Manager

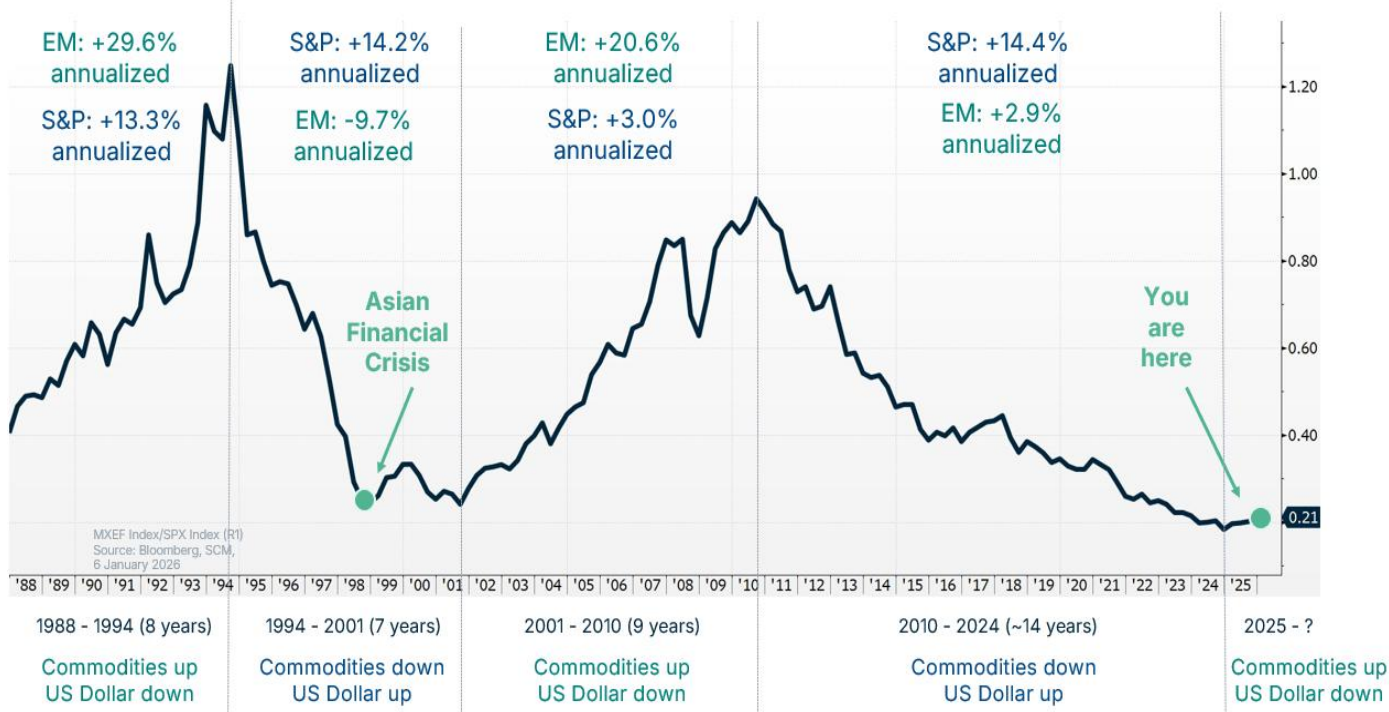
The Steyn Capital Global Emerging Markets Fund returned 34.50% in 2025, compared to a return of 30.21% for the Emerging Markets Index⁵.

The year was characterised by several global macro developments that influenced market sentiment. These included the introduction of Liberation Day tariffs and escalating conflict in the Middle East during the first half of the year, continued enthusiasm around artificial intelligence, a weakening US dollar, and strength in precious metals. Within Emerging Markets, the AI theme also took hold, with strong performance across Chinese, Korean and Taiwanese technology stocks driving the broad EM index to its best calendar-year performance since 2017.

Even after the past year's strong performance, the Emerging Markets index relative to the S&P 500 remains close to historic extremes: it is still below levels last seen during the 1998 Asian Financial Crisis and remains only modestly above its all-time low reached in December 2024. But as investors begin to reassess the risks of portfolios heavily concentrated in now expensive US equities after a long period of US outperformance, we expect continued diversification toward international and especially Emerging Markets. Given the extremity of the starting point, we believe this rotation has a long way to run.

In the last EM bull-market of the early 2000's, Emerging Market equities outperformed US markets by close to 17% per annum for almost a decade. With expectations for a weaker US dollar becoming more widely held, and commodities from precious to base metals beginning to show strength, the historical ingredients for significant Emerging Market outperformance are once again in place.

The largest contributor in the year was Mandarin Oriental, which was also our largest holding for much of the period. We discussed this investment in detail in our previous quarterly letter and refer readers there for a full discussion of the investment thesis. In October, the company's controlling shareholder, Jardine Matheson, made a take-private offer at a 40% premium to the prevailing price share price, and a 90% premium to our average acquisition cost. Our internal rate of return on this investment over our holding period was 102%.

Hanwha Aerospace, a Korean aerospace and defence company also contributed meaningfully to returns. The business has benefited from increased global defence spending following Russia's invasion of Ukraine in 2022, particularly in Europe, after more than three decades of declining real defence budgets. We exited the position in December after the share price had increased approximately sevenfold from our initial purchase in January 2024. Over our holding period, the investment generated an internal rate of return of 197%.

Piraeus Port Authority also contributed positively during the year. The company continues to report earnings growth ahead of market expectations and benefits from its strategic location near Athens, with rail links into fast-growing Eastern European economies. In addition to its core container operations, the port operates the region's leading car terminal and a cruise terminal that is benefiting from strong tourism demand. Operational performance remains solid, with resilient domestic activity and tourism offsetting weaker transshipment volumes related to disruptions in the Red Sea. The business maintains a net cash balance sheet and strong free cash flow generation, which we expect to improve further following the completion of a major capital expenditure programme.

Detractors

Detractors during the year were relatively modest. The largest included our Argentine bank holdings, which we exited during the third quarter following a deterioration in the outlook for Argentina's economic recovery and rising political risk ahead of elections. Our Turkish holdings also detracted, reflecting weaker consumer conditions and sentiment after strong performance in the prior year.

Portfolio Positioning

At quarter end, the portfolio was 97% invested across 40 positions. The portfolio remains geographically diversified, with the largest exposures to China at 16.6%, Greece at 8.8%, and diversified Emerging Market holdings, comprising companies with multiple geographic exposures, at 8.2%.

Footnotes

¹High risk portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than any other risk profiled portfolios and therefore tend to carry higher volatility. Volatility is a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index. Expected potential long term returns could be higher than other risk profiles, in turn potential losses of capital could be higher.

²The NAV (net asset value) represents the assets of the portfolio less its liabilities.

³The portfolio's Total Expense Ratio (TER) reflects the percentage of the average Net Asset Value (NAV) of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. During the phase in period TER's do not include information gathered over a full year. Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the portfolio incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the portfolio's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the portfolio and impacts portfolio returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of portfolio, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER. TER and TC ratios are calculated on a quarterly basis.

⁴Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a one year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

⁵The Fund is benchmark agnostic. Performance is shown relative to an index for illustrative purposes only, in accordance with BN 92. The Index represents an internally calculated emerging market composite index based on equal weightings of three listed emerging market ETFs. Index calculation details are available from the Investment Manager on request.
