INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The aim is to maximise investor total return over the long term through a focused portfolio of high quality JSE listed equity securities.

The Fund has adhered to its policy objective.

FUND FEATURES

A concentrated equity-only portfolio that may invest across all sectors of the JSE. The portfolio will hold between 20 – 30 companies.

FUND COMMENTARY

After a constructive start to the month, gains were quickly reversed as the outcome of the national elections became evident. The JSE Capped SWIX was up +3.4% in the lead up to the national elections, ultimately ending the month up +0.9%.

Following the announcement in April of BHP's unsolicited bid for Anglo American, and Anglo's subsequent rejection, BHP's proposed final terms to motivate the potential combination. Anglo's board once again rejected BHP's bid, stating BHP's offer had not adequately addressed the execution/value risk of the proposed transaction structure. BHP subsequently declined to make a firm offer for Anglo's, BHP citing its commitment to its internal Capital Allocation Framework. The Stonehage Fleming Equity Prescient Fund has a 5.0% allocation to BHP and 1.7% holding in Anglo American (the Anglo's position initiated in April 2024).

Richemont reported FY24 results, with group sales up by +3.0% over the period at actual exchange rates (and by 8.0% at constant exchange rates). Sales grew in all regions for the third year in a row, with strong growth resuming in the Asia-Pacific region. Additionally, the group announced the appointment of Van Cleef & Arpels CEO Nicolas Bos as Group CEO, which we view as a positive development given his track record at VC&A.

Pepkor's interim results to 31 March 2024 reported revenue growth of +9.5%, assisted by their Brazilian retailer Avenida (+23.4%) and the African Division (+22.8%). The SA divisions (Pep, Ackermans, Speciality and Furniture) reported mid-single-digit growth. The Fintech division, whilst still small relative to the rest of the group was a bright spot in SA, growing revenue +24.5%. Operating costs and finance expenses were elevated, which equated to a bottom line profit decline of -3.5%. There was a non-recurring gain in the prior period and on a normalized basis headline earnings grew +7.8%.

Tencent, which is the key underlying investment of Naspers and Prosus, posted a pleasing first quarter result to 31 March 2024. Top line revenue grew 6.0%, whilst margins improved materially. Gross profit grew +23.0%, Core Operating profit grew +30.2%, and Core Profit attributable to equity holders grew +54.5%, as the bottom line margin improved from 22% to 32%. Additionally, Naspers and Prosus announced the appointment of Fabricio Bloisi as their new CEO. Bloisi has been the CEO of iFoods, a Prosus investee company, since 2013.

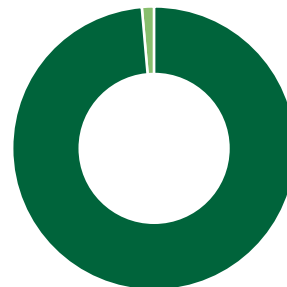
- Seek to identify exceptional businesses with sustainable long-term growth prospects and durable competitive advantages
