INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to deliver attractive, risk-managed returns through exposure to the South African bond market, while outperforming the All-Bond Index (ALBI).

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund invests in South African bonds, inflation-linked bonds, money market instruments, credit instruments, interest-bearing securities and financial instruments. Apart from assets in liquid form, the Fund may also invest in portfolios of collective investment schemes or other similar schemes. The Fund achieves the investment objective by seeking enhancement opportunities by focusing on cost-effective and financially sound quantitative techniques through a portable alpha process.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors looking for systematic exposure to the bond market, where alpha is generated from uncorrelated sources. This Fund is Reg. 28 complaint.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios aim to minimise benchmark relative risk. While there may be occasional capital volatility, it is expected to align with the fluctuations experienced by the benchmark. These portfolios are managed in such a manner that the probability of capital losses over one year periods is unlikely. These portfolios typically target returns in the region of 3% - 4% above inflation over the long term.

FUND COMMENTARY

Market Context

In December, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) reduced the federal funds rate by 25 basis points, signalling progress toward its dual mandate of maximum employment and price stability.

The post-meeting statement was updated to emphasize that the extent and timing of additional rate adjustments will depend on incoming economic data, the overall outlook, and the balance of risks. This suggests a slower pace of future rate cuts compared to earlier expectations.

According to the Summary of Economic Projections (SEP), the median forecast now anticipates two additional 25 basis point cuts in 2025, resulting in a federal funds rate of 3.875%, down from the previously projected four cuts. For 2026, two further 25 basis point cuts are expected, lowering the rate to 3.375%. By 2027, one more 25 basis point reduction is projected, bringing the terminal rate to 3.125%, compared to the earlier estimate of 2.875%.

The updated projections also indicate higher forecasts for both core and headline inflation through 2026, a lower unemployment rate forecast for 2024 and 2025, and stronger GDP growth expectations for the same period.

Outlook

South African bond yields continue to respond to pricing impulses from geopolitical developments, Central Bank actions, and their consequent effects on global financial conditions.

For some emerging economies, high risk-free policy rates, combined with a strong dollar and weaker demand from advanced economies, could increase capital outflow pressures—particularly for commodity importers facing higher commodity prices and weaker exchange rates.

These pressures pose challenges, especially for borrowers with currency mismatches between their assets and liabilities, creating a significant "risk-off" environment.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
