



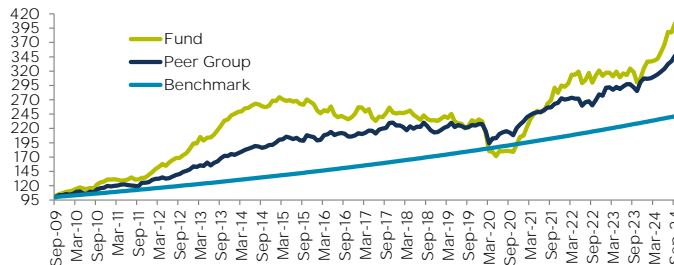
### FUND OBJECTIVE & STRATEGY

The ClucasGray Future Titans Prescient Fund has a flexible mandate to invest in a range of asset classes but will typically have high exposure to companies outside of the Top 40 Index. The fund is permitted to invest 25% offshore plus an additional 5% in Africa. The primary objective of the fund is to achieve real long-term capital growth ahead of CPI + 6%. The fund looks to acquire fast growing, mispriced, mid-and small-cap shares, "Future Titans", on the back of high conviction fundamental investment calls. The fund has a deep value / activist bias.

### WHO SHOULD INVEST

### MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Investor sentiment has improved materially since the elections as elected officials have finally realised that a stagnant economy doesn't make for a supportive electorate. Management teams across corporate South Africa are reporting significantly more engagement with elected officials as government tries to reform many of the issues impeding economic growth. Minister Parks Tau, the new Trade, Industry and Competition minister, in particular is lauded for reaching out to business - a very different approach to his predecessor, Minister Patel, who was regarded as very unfriendly to business. This improved sentiment has seen many projects given the green light after months of inactivity and resulted in a rerating of many depressed South African equities. Another Minister doing a sterling job is the Minister of Home Affairs, who has allowed for increased Chinese and Indian tourism by reforming the holiday visa system. We would expect this to add to a very buoyant Cape tourism market which is why we have added Southern Sun Hotels to the portfolio. The operational gearing of higher room occupancy climbing from 58% and room rates coming off a depressed rate averaging R1,388 will significantly lift earnings in the years ahead - every 1% increase in occupancy adds R70m in revenue, of which 70% falls to the bottom line, while every R100 increase in the room rate adds R300m in earnings. The G20 summit to be hosted by South Africa in 2025 will add to the tourism boost, ensuring 2025 should deliver bumper earnings for the company.

Advtech announced the acquisition of the FNB training facility in Sandton which will be turned into a university campus to house 9,000 students. The tertiary business has the highest margin in the group but the existing facility in Benmore is very overcrowded operating on a two-shift system with a Crawford school next door. We anticipate the private tertiary education facilities will be granted the use of University branding which should strengthen their brands. Advtech is rolling these tertiary university operations into Africa as the business model is capital light (much like selling software) and, with millions of students in Africa requiring tertiary education, demand is high.

The Fund has adhered to its policy objective. The number of participatory units at 30 September 2024 was 53 315 021. The current asset allocation versus the previous quarter is as follows:

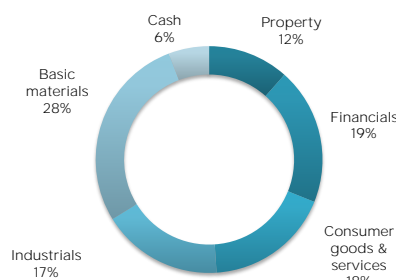
