INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to return CPI + 3% per annum through a full interest rate cycle while providing stability by aiming never to lose capital over any rolling 3 month period.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

This Fund invests in local and offshore money market, bonds, property, preference shares, inflation-linked bonds and derivatives to meet the investment objectives. Fund performance can be generated from taking interest rate views or duration, yield enhancement via credit instruments, asset allocation between income producing asset classes, offshore exposure and also via the use of derivatives.

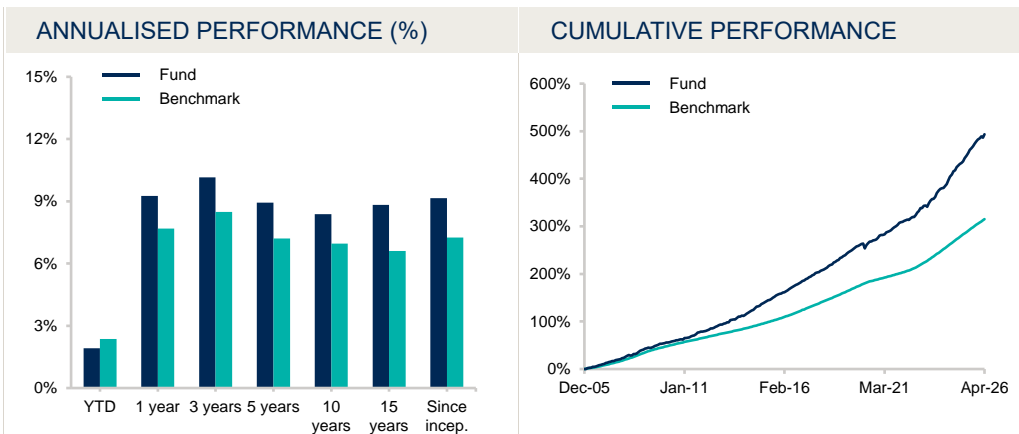
WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking stable real returns and aiming to maximise income via exposure to primarily the South African Money and Bond markets. This Fund is suitable to investors with a short- to medium-term investment horizon and is Regulation 28 compliant.

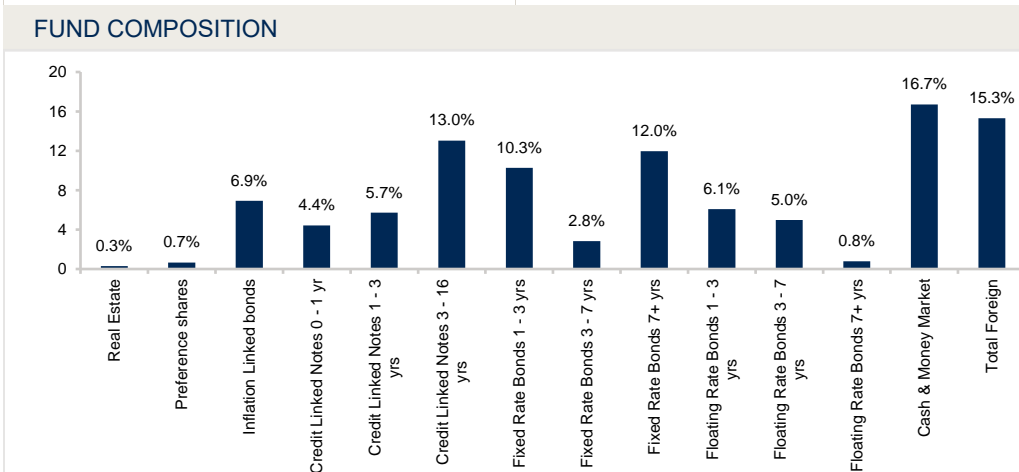
RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

FUND COMMENTARY

South African fixed-income markets recovered strongly in April, retracing a meaningful portion of the March sell-off as global risk sentiment improved. A partial de-escalation of Middle East tensions, including reports of Iranian proposals to reopen the Strait of Hormuz, saw oil prices ease from their March highs and provided some relief on the global inflation outlook. Against this backdrop, government bond yields rallied both globally and locally, with South African government bonds benefitting from renewed foreign interest and a firmer rand. The longer end of the curve led the move, partially reversing the term premium build-up seen in March, while shorter-dated yields also moved lower but to a lesser extent.

The South African Reserve Bank did not meet in April, but the release of the April Monetary Policy Review reinforced the cautious tone struck at the March meeting. Governor Kganyago reiterated the Bank's commitment to the 3% inflation target and warned that "interest rates are likely to remain elevated for longer", with headline inflation expected to average 3.7% in 2026 before easing back to target by late 2027. March CPI printed at 3.1%, marginally above February's 3.0% but still close to the SARB's target. While the near-term inflation profile remains sensitive to the April fuel price hike and lingering currency pass-through, the absence of an immediate further shock allowed the market to partly unwind the bearish positioning established in March.

Globally, April was a more constructive month for fixed income. US Treasuries traded in a relatively narrow range, with the 10-year yield ending the month around 4.39%, broadly unchanged from end-March levels, after the Federal Reserve held rates steady at its 29 April meeting amid notable internal dissent. Easing oil prices through much of the month and softer US Q1 GDP supported sentiment, although yields backed up modestly into month-end as US-Iran peace talks hit an impasse. Emerging market debt benefitted from the more stable global backdrop, and South African bonds outperformed given still-attractive real yields, an improving rand, and the partial reversal of the foreign outflows seen in March.

Within this environment, the Fund continued to focus on capital preservation, liquidity and high-quality income generation, while benefitting from the duration we added at the end of March into the sell-off. The extension of duration via fixed-rate bonds contributed positively as yields rallied through April, validating the decision to take advantage of the repricing. The Fund's bias toward shorter-dated and floating-rate instruments continues to provide a stable income base, while the tactical duration positioning enhances total return potential without compromising the risk target. We remain comfortable that prospective yields, although tighter than at end-March, still offer attractive carry relative to the Fund's risk profile, and we continue to look for selective opportunities to lock in real yields at appealing levels.

The Fund's forward yield remains attractive at 9.39%. The Fund has an interest rate duration of 1.94 years and a total duration (including ILBs) of 2.04 years. The current risk profile aligns with the Fund's risk objective, and we believe the Fund is well positioned to achieve its return objectives.

The Fund delivered a positive performance in April, supported by the rally in fixed-income markets. Key contributors were the duration assets added to the portfolio at the end of March, which benefitted from the move lower in yields, alongside the higher-yielding assets in the portfolio. The currency hedge in place was a modest detractor as the rand strengthened, though this was more than offset by the gains on duration and credit holdings.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Forward Yield: The Forward Yield is the expected combined income of the instruments in the portfolio over the next year expressed as a percentage of the current value of those instruments.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
