

### Investment Objective

The objective of this portfolio is to deliver long term capital growth through broadbased exposure to global equities. The portfolio aims to generate returns in line with global equity markets over any rolling 7-10-year period and maintains a high risk profile. The portfolio returns are denominated in Rands. Please be advised the portfolio may be subject to currency fluctuations due to its international exposure.

### Investment Strategy

The **Oribi Global Equity Prescient Fund of Funds** will, seeks to maximise long-term capital growth by investing primarily in global equities. The Fund maintains a minimum of 80% effective equity exposure and invests exclusively in collective investment schemes. These underlying funds may include limited exposure to property, preference shares, money market instruments, and mixed-interest securities to enhance diversification.

While the Fund is focused on global equity markets, it allows for limited exposure between local and offshore assets to respond to changing economic and market conditions. All investments comply with relevant regulatory guidelines and may include both listed and unlisted instruments.

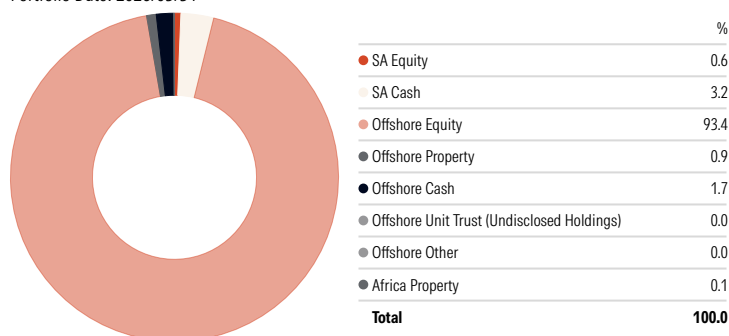

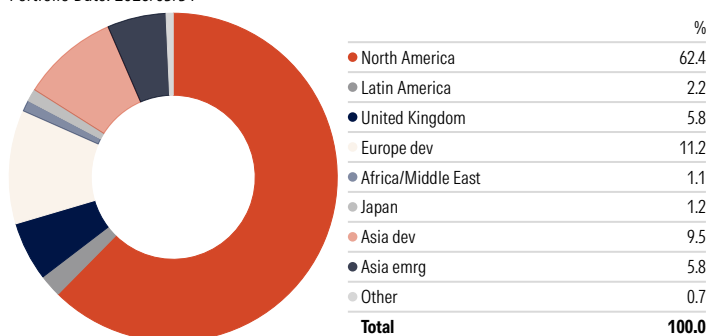
### Asset Allocation

Portfolio Date: 2026/03/31



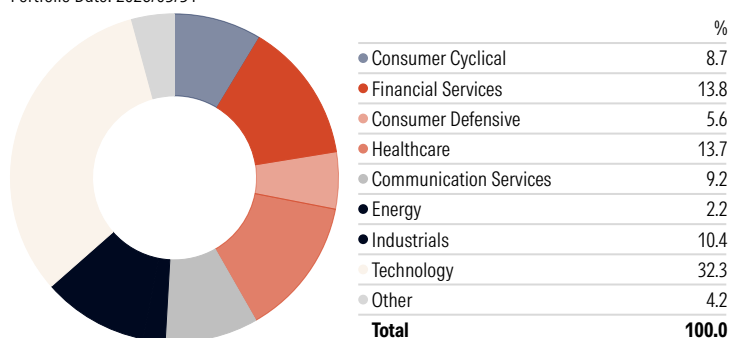
### Equity Regional Exposure

### Quarterly Fund Commentary

Equity investors delivered relatively weak absolute returns in the first quarter of 2026, in what was a challenging market for most major asset classes. Global equities struggled in Q1 2026, with most regions and sectors posting negative returns over the quarter. However, the rand's depreciation during the quarter was a tailwind for offshore equities, contributing to overall performance amid a weak market environment.

#### Asset Allocation

Global equities struggled in Q1 2026, with most regions and sectors posting negative returns over the quarter. U.S. equities lagged the broader market over the quarter, particularly within the Tech sector, while most regions struggled under the weight of higher rates and energy costs. Trades that had been beneficial prior to the conflict unwound, most notably with gold and emerging markets (EM) stocks falling while the U.S. dollar strengthened against most currencies. All in, it was the weakest quarter for equities since 2022 — but not one that warrants panic. Our portfolios are constructed to withstand a range of scenarios, and the current environment remains well within those expectations. A rotation away from mega-cap tech drove value stocks to outperform growth stocks, while emerging markets (-0.1%) outperformed developed markets (-3.9%) over the quarter, despite Middle East-related pressures.

#### Fund Selection

Old Mutual Global Equity delivered negative performance in Q1 2026, underperforming its benchmark and posting a second quartile return against the ASISA Global Equity General peer group. Underperformance was driven by broad-based headwinds across both sector and country allocations, with technology holdings as the primary drag. Microsoft (-20.8%), CoStar Group (-38.02%), and Apple (-3.5%) weighed on returns, alongside NVIDIA (-3.4%) and Tesla (-14.6%). On the positive side, energy and healthcare holdings contributed, with Eni S.p.A. (+57.8%), Johnson & Johnson (+22.7%), and Fujikura (+43.9%) among the notable contributors over the quarter.

Fundsmith Equity delivered disappointing performance over the quarter, underperforming both its MSCI World benchmark and the peer group over the time period. The fund's quality-growth investment style was largely out of favour in the first quarter, which impacted the performance of this fund and comparable peers negatively. Stock selection, particularly in the healthcare sector, was the main cause of underperformance. Healthcare holdings such as Waters Corp (-19.0%), Novo Nordisk (-25.6%) and IDEXX Laboratories (-14.2%) were the main detractors from performance. In addition, the fund's holdings in LVMH (-27.2%) and Amadeus IT Group (20.6%) also negatively impacted performance over the quarter.

The Allan Gray Orbis Global Equity FF produced a positive return and first quartile performance over the first quarter of 2026. Performance was primarily driven by strong stock selection across technology, industrials, and financials. SK Square (+23.2%) and Samsung Electronics (+35.5%) were the largest contributors, followed by XPO Inc (+47.9%) and Westlake Corp (+64.1%), with Itau Unibanco (+22.1%) also adding value. However, healthcare holdings weighed on returns, with Icon PLC (-37.3%), Bruker Corp (-20.7%), and UnitedHealth Group (-14.7%) being the primary detractors alongside Sea Ltd ADR (-32.9%).

Ninety One Global Franchise FF delivered disappointing performance over the quarter, underperforming both its MSCI ACWI benchmark and the peer group over quarter. The fund's quality growth investment style was largely out of favour in the first quarter, which impacted the performance of this fund and comparable peers negatively. The fund's holdings in ASML (+23.3%), Phillip Morris (+7.4%) and Electronic Arts (+3.2%) contributed to performance, while holdings in Microsoft (-20.8%), Visa (-10.8%) and Booking Holdings (-18.6%) were the largest detractors.

#### Summary

Portfolios delivered relatively weak absolute returns in the first quarter, as most major asset classes struggled over the period. Despite this, longer-term performance remains intact, with portfolios generally outperforming peers over the past 12 months and beyond. The Portfolio continues to be allocated to a diverse range of attractively priced local and global asset classes. We remain comfortable with the positioning of the Portfolio, the Portfolio continues to be allocated to a diverse range of attractively priced local and global asset classes. ### Glossary Summary

**Annualised performance:** Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.
