

Strategy

The portfolio manager has a disciplined, fundamentals-driven bottom-up security selection approach to capture structural growth across the breadth of the Asian universe. The focus is on identifying businesses that have strong business models with a clear runway of growth. Such businesses are well managed by teams with a robust track record and a strong sustainability-oriented mindset. ESG considerations are well integrated in the investment process. The outcome is a portfolio that offers 'quality growth at a reasonable price' with potential for a strong relative performance over market cycles.

Objectives & Investment Policy

Objective: The fund aims to achieve capital growth long term.

Investment Policy: The fund invests at least 70% (and normally 75%) of its assets, in equities of companies that are listed, headquartered or do most of their business in Asia (excluding Japan) including emerging markets. The fund will have a mixture of investments in larger, medium and smaller sized companies. The fund will seek opportunities in special situations equities which are shares in companies that generally have attractive valuations in relation to net assets or earning potential and/or companies which are undervalued and whose recovery potential is not recognised by the market. The fund may also invest in money market instruments on an ancillary basis. The fund may invest in the following assets according to the percentages indicated: China A and B shares (directly and/or indirectly): less than 30% (in aggregate) SPACs: less than 5%

Investment Process: In actively managing the fund, the Investment Manager considers the durability of long-term growth prospects that are not fully reflected in current valuations. This includes a focus on special situations such as merger, acquisition and internal restructuring activity, that may affect company's valuations in the short-term. The Investment Manager considers ESG characteristics when assessing investment risks and opportunities. In determining ESG characteristics, the Investment Manager takes into account ESG ratings provided by Fidelity or external agencies. The fund aims to achieve an ESG score of its portfolio greater than that of its benchmark. Through the investment management process the Investment Manager aims to ensure that investee companies follow good governance practices. Derivatives and Techniques: The fund may use derivatives for hedging and for efficient portfolio management.

Cumulative performance in USD (rebased to 100)




Performance for 12 month periods in USD (%)
