The Fund will aim to deliver higher levels of income compared to money market funds.

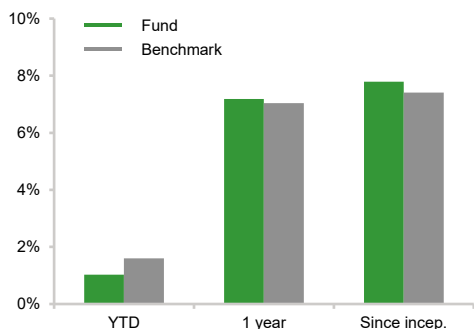
INVESTMENT POLICY

RISK INDICATOR

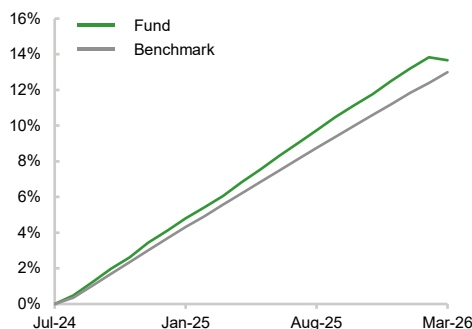


ANNUALIZED PERFORMANCE (%)

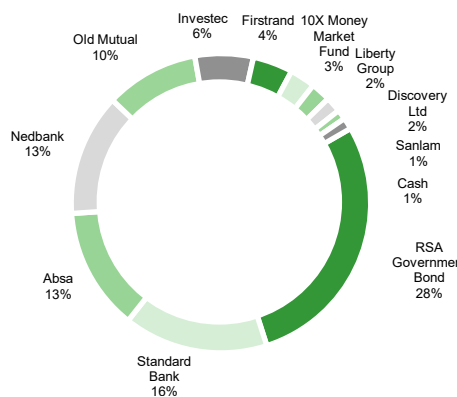

FUND COMMENTARY

South African fixed income delivered a volatile but broadly constructive performance in Q1 2026, following the strong rally seen in 2025. Government bond yields remained near multi-year lows early in the quarter, supported by easing inflation, a firmer rand and improved investor sentiment, with the 10-year yield dipping below 8% at one point. However, momentum reversed into March as global inflation concerns and renewed geopolitical tensions—particularly linked to energy markets—triggered a sell-off, pushing yields higher and weighing on returns. Globally, stubborn inflation and strong US growth suggested interest rates would stay higher for longer, while rising oil prices added cost pressures. In South Africa, a weaker rand pushed up the cost of imports, especially fuel and food, and ongoing increases in administered prices added further pressure. While inflation was still relatively contained, risks shifted higher, making central banks more cautious and reducing expectations for rate cuts. Despite this, South African bonds continue to offer attractive real yields and remain supported by a relatively stable domestic inflation outlook and expectations of gradual monetary easing later in 2026, underpinning a cautiously positive medium-term outlook for the asset class.

Risk Indicator Definition

These portfolios typically have no or low equity exposure, resulting in higher interest yields and stable capital values with the probability of capital losses over the shorter term (3 months) highly unlikely. These portfolios typically target returns in the region of 1% – 3% above inflation before tax over the long term.

Disclosure

The portfolio has adhered to its objective and there were no material changes to the composition of the Fund portfolio during the quarter.

Glossary

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).
