Investment Managers

Investment and Return Objective

The investment objective of the Fund is to provide an attractive total return to investors, applying a conservative income focussed investment style and targeting capital preservation.

Investment Process

To achieve this objective, the fund will be investing primarily through global collective investment schemes (and / or directly) in a diversified portfolio of predominantly defensive assets, such as government fixed income securities and investment grade corporate fixed income securities. The fund will also allocate limited exposure to growth assets such as equities, high yield fixed income securities, emerging market fixed income securities as well as real assets. The Fund may use financial derivative instruments for efficient portfolio management purposes and hedging.

There is no geographic or sectoral bias intended and the Fund will have exposure to both developed and emerging markets.

Suitable Investors

The Fund is suitable for investors who have a low to medium risk profile and who wish to capture upside attractive total returns from income producing assets while minimising downside volatility over the medium to long term.

FUND COMMENTARY

The third quarter market performance was driven by three main macro drivers. Firstly, a shift in focus from inflation to growth, notably employment growth, by the US FOMC. Secondly a pivot by Chinese authorities, introducing fiscal and monetary stimulus and, lastly, ongoing geo-political events, including war in the middle east and US elections.

Even though US inflation has been deflating, strong second quarter growth in the US supported earnings growth and equity markets. Forward PEs are elevated but high frequency growth indicators still points to above trend growth in the third quarter. The third quarter started off with somewhat softer US employment numbers driving short term interest rate expectations lower and dragging longer term bonds with it. Both investment grade and high yield credit spreads were volatile over the quarter, contracting slightly over the quarter.

Softer growth expectations in China driven by a very weak consumer spooked the authorities late in the quarter driving a pivot in fiscal and monetary policy. The stimulus which is not nearly as large to previous episodes in 2008 13% of GDP and 2016 9% of GDP is expected to be around just 1.5% of GDP. The announcement did spark a strong rally in the Chinese equity market, but we are sceptical if it will remedy the structural problems in the property sector. The announcement lends some support to commodities as iron ore, coal and copper prices improved. The positive from the announcement is that the Chinese markets will be less of a drag on global growth when the US economy soften over the next year.

Geo-political risks remain elevated, the recent escalation of violence in the middle east is driving the oil and gold prices up and can have a major impact on global growth.

The Fund performed well over the quarter as growth assets and modified duration contributed handsomely to performance supported by receiving carry from short dated high quality fixed income assets. Growth assets contributed close to 30% of the gross USD performance, compared to around 15% in the second quarter. Duration contributed close to 25% of the gross USD performance. The carry derived from the ZAR share class hedging yielded around 2.4% p.a. for the quarter.

The fund added underlying exposure to global short duration funds, added equity exposure to S&P 500 equally weighted Index and to Emerging market equity exposure. The fund is still relatively conservatively positioned.





Glossary

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Performance fee incl. in TER (%) PF (%): The Performance Fee is a payment made to the Fund Manager for generating outperformance and is generally calculated as percentage of outperformance, often both realized and unrealized.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).
