FUND COMMENTARY

Global equity markets delivered strong gains in May, with robust corporate earnings offset ongoing concerns around elevated oil prices and sticky inflation. The MSCI World Index advanced 4.55% as risk appetite broadened and emerging markets led the way.

In the United States, equities posted a robust month, with the S&P 500 advancing 5.26%. The move reflected resilient corporate earnings and a constructive macro backdrop, with leadership broadening beyond the largest growth names. European equities also delivered solid returns, with the Euro Stoxx Index rising 3.42%. Performance was supported by improving sentiment and constructive economic data across the region. Japan was the standout developed market, with the Nikkei 225 surging 10.04% on the back of strong earnings momentum and continued investor interest in the Japanese reflation story.

Emerging markets were the strongest performing asset class in May, with the MSCI EM index returning 9.69%, driven by exceptional strength in North Asian technology names. Korea's KOSPI surged 28% and Taiwan's TAIEX approximately 14%. Both markets propelled by AI-driven semiconductor demand, as US hyperscalers (Microsoft, Alphabet, Amazon, Meta) committed to sizeable capital expenditure for the year, directly benefitting the region's dominant chip and technology supply chains. Chinese equities were more modest, with the CSI 300 adding 2.71%.

Overall, May was characterised by strong, broad-based gains across global markets, with Japan and emerging markets leading the way and developed market leadership widening beyond US mega-caps. Locally, the picture was more nuanced - headline index returns were held back by weakness in the technology heavyweights. The month nonetheless extended the constructive tone seen through the second quarter, with risk assets continuing to find support from resilient earnings and a steadier macro backdrop.

The top contributors to the Fund's performance for the month were Micron Technology (87.76%), Apple (15.00%) and Advanced Micro Devices (45.59%). Detractors included Walmart (-12.26%), Carvana A (-81.56%) and JPMorgan Chase & Co (-4.44%).

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

PE Ratio: The weighted average price earnings ratio of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The price earnings ratio of each company is the price divided by the earnings per share.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

Derivatives risk: The use of derivatives could increase overall risk by magnifying the effect of both gains and losses in a Fund. As such, large changes in value and potentially large financial losses could result.

Interest rate risk: The value of fixed income investments (e.g. bonds) tends to be inversely related to interest and inflation rates. Hence their value decreases when interest rates and/or inflation rises.

Transaction Costs(TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction cost are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

This yield is subject to change as market rates and underlying investments change.
