The fund is primarily exposed to a focused portfolio of developed market equities. The fund is managed on the basis of the long term ownership of assets and has a bias towards high quality ideas. Investors with a time horizon of three to five years are ideally suited to this fund.

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MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The ClucasGray Global Fund declined -1.2% in February while the Morningstar Aggressive Allocation peer group fell -0.8%. The MSCI All Country World index ended -0.7% lower in a volatile trading month.

February saw a clear rotation in global equity markets on both a geographic and sector basis. US equities (S&P500 -1.4%), which have led market performance for most of the last decade, saw steep outflows as investors grew increasingly concerned about the impact of tari ff policies on inflation, economic growth and monetary policy, with a market backdrop characterised by elevated valuations and crowded investor positio ning. Money flowed, instead, to Europe (Stoxx 50 + 3.1%) where equity valuations appear cheap, economies are showing signs of improvement and the likelihood of a ceasefire in the Russia-Ukraine war is increasing. On a sector basis, and in-line with the composition of the above indices, money flowed out of high-growth technology related sectors such as Communication Services (-3.7%), Information technology (-2.0%) and Consumer Discretionary (-5.0%) into more value-oriented sectors like Consumer Staples (+4.2%) and Financials (+1.9%)

Manufacturing activity in the US (PMI 50.3) expanded for a second month in February following two years of contraction, while European manufacturing improved again (PMI 47.6) but remains in contraction territory. While broadly stable, the US labour market showed some weakness relative to expectations last month, with 151 000 new jobs added but an uptick in the unemployment rate to 4.1%. Average wage increases (+4.0%) remain robust.

The Fund's largest positive performance came from consumer giant Nestle (+13.2%) which alleviated investor concerns by reaffirming profitability targets. The share also benefitted from sector and geographic rotation. Euronext (+7.9%) also performed well as strong results prompted positive revisions to earnings estimates. Negative performances came from Alphabet (-16.5%) and TSMC (-13.8%), both caught up in the sharp rotation away from technology sectors

During the month, the Fund initiated a position in HCA Healthcare, HCA owns and operates the largest hospital network in the US, with significant scale advantages resulting in sector-leading profitability. The company has a long track record of consistent growth and cash generation, supported by secular demographic trends such as an ageing population. The position was partially funded through the sale of Elevance, where an ear nings reset has raised questions about management's credibility. The Fund also sold the residual position in Electronics Arts where the outlook for the company's key global football game has become more challenged.

At the end of the month the Fund had an underlying exposure to equities of 95.8%, and 4.2% cash.

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
