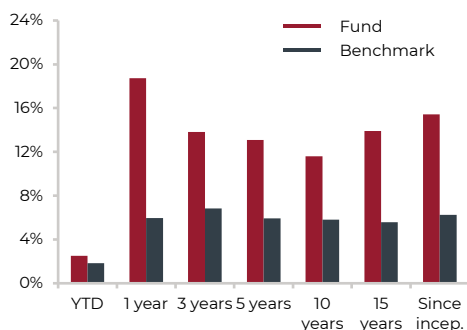

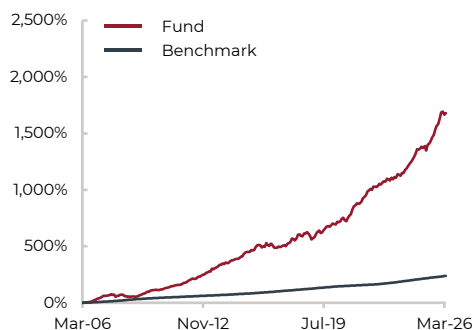
RISK INDICATOR

ANNUALISED PERFORMANCE (%)

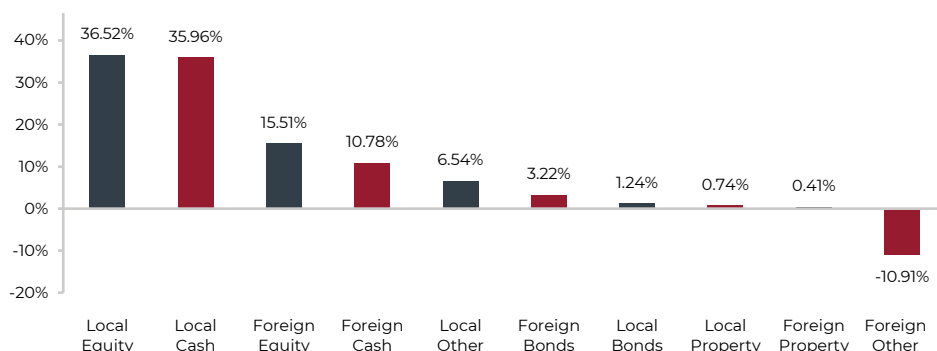

FUND COMMENTARY

South African equities delivered a volatile first quarter of 2026, with strong gains in January and February offset by a sharp sell-off in March. The FTSE/JSE All Share Index ended the quarter down -1.5% QoQ, as a powerful rally in precious metal and financial stocks was reversed by a broad-based decline driven by global shocks. The FTSE/JSE All Bond Index declined -3.4% QoQ as yields rose sharply towards the end of the quarter. SA-listed property also came under significant pressure, falling -5.4% QoQ, as major asset classes weakened into quarter-end. Resource stocks led both the upside and downside and closed the quarter up +5.5% QoQ, benefiting from strong precious metal prices early in the quarter before correcting sharply amid rising global yields and a stronger US dollar, which appreciated by +2.3% QoQ against the South African rand. Financials rallied strongly in February but ended the quarter slightly lower (-0.9% QoQ), while industrials lagged throughout and ended the quarter down -9.3%. The quarter ended with one of the worst monthly drawdowns since 2020, as a global energy shock and rising inflation expectations triggered a sharp reversal in risk assets. In US dollar terms, South African equities declined -3.8% QoQ, broadly in line with the MSCI World (-3.9% QoQ) but underperforming the MSCI Emerging Markets (-0.5% QoQ), as a weaker rand and global risk aversion weighed on returns.

Global equity markets experienced a pronounced regime shift during Q1, transitioning from a risk-on, disinflationary environment to one dominated by geopolitical risk and inflation concerns. The MSCI World Index declined -3.9% QoQ, as gains earlier in the quarter were reversed by a sharp sell-off in March. Commodities were the standout asset class, with the Bloomberg Commodity Index rising +23.3% QoQ, driven by a surge in oil prices following the disruption of key supply routes. Brent crude rose sharply (+94.5% QoQ), recording one of its largest monthly increases in decades. Gold reached all-time highs of US\$5,597/oz early in the quarter and closed the period up +8.1% QoQ. Rising energy prices and inflation fears prompted a reassessment of the global monetary policy outlook, with markets shifting from pricing in rate cuts to anticipating a more prolonged period of elevated rates. Bond markets sold off globally, particularly at the short end of the curve.

GLOSSARY

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Sortino Ratio: A measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. It is a modification of the Sharpe ratio but only penalises the returns falling below a user specified target, or required rate of return, while the Sharpe ratio penalises both upside and downside volatility equally.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Performance fee incl. in TER (%) PF (%): The Performance Fee is a payment made to the Fund Manager for generating outperformance and is generally calculated as percentage of outperformance, often both realized and unrealized.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).

A "qualified investor" means any person, who invests a minimum amount of R1 million per hedge fund and who:

1. Has demonstrable knowledge and experience in financial and business matters which would enable the investor to assess the merits and risks of a hedge fund investment, or
