

# PRESCIENT CORE CAPPED EQUITY FUND (A2)

## MINIMUM DISCLOSURE DOCUMENT & GENERAL INVESTOR REPORT

### INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to deliver returns close to the FTSE/JSE Africa Capped Shareholder Weighted Total Return Index at low cost. Although the Fund is structured similarly to the Capped SWIX, it can out / underperform the Capped SWIX by small amounts over time.

### INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund follows an investment policy which firstly endeavours to follow the composition of the Capped SWIX closely and secondly seeks enhancement opportunities to secure for investors an optimum overall return. In addition to investing in physical assets, the Fund can use derivatives to create exposure to the Capped SWIX or subsets thereof in a low cost and efficient manner.

### WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors who are seeking long term capital growth through exposure to the South Africa equity market by investing in a fund with a low tracking error relative to the Capped SWIX and who are cost conscious.

### RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios typically hold meaningful equity and/or offshore exposure which may result in significant capital volatility over all periods. Due to their nature expected long term returns are higher than for the other risk categories.

## FUND COMMENTARY

June consolidated a positive period for global equity markets. As we cross over to the second half of the calendar year, the MSCI World index gained 2.03% and 2.66% for the month and quarter respectively, stretching the year-to-date return to an impressive 11.75%. This bout of performance continues to be largely driven by technology counters in the US, where softer economic data in May has seemingly revived expectations of monetary policy easing in the near term. The S&P 500 index closed the month just off its newly found all time highs to return 3.59% and 4.28% for the month and quarter respectively. European markets on the other hand fared less favourably. Despite a relatively well telegraphed move by the European Central Bank (ECB) to lower interest rates, uncertainty on the back of upcoming elections in the region dampened investor sentiment. The Eurostoxx index was down 4.03% and 4.29% respectively for the month and quarter albeit still positive 2.46% year-to-date. Asian markets were similarly sluggish. Despite posting a marginally positive return, up 0.50% for the month, Japans' Nikkei 225 index suffered a sizeable drawdown, down 7.25% for the quarter in US dollars as the Yen continues to slip. China's CSI 300 index gave back 3.64% for the month to close the quarter and year to date periods down 2.23% and 10.08% respectively. With still some ground to make up, Emerging market equities outperformed the developed markets over the month and quarter, the MSCI EM index up 3.94% and 5.29% respectively.

Locally, political developments were in the foreground as market participants grappled with the potential constitution of the new government. The markets rallied with a sigh of relief as an agreement was reached that will enable a 'market friendly' government to be formed. The financials sector led the equity market higher, closing the month up an impressive 14.51% for the month and 14.35% for the quarter. Resources were the primary underperformers, down 3.67% for the month, albeit still positive 3.16% for the quarter. The rand strengthened considerably on the back of the market favourable election outcome to close the month and quarter at 18.19 to the US dollar.

The FTSE/JSE Capped Shareholder Weighted Index closed the month up 4.17%. The Prescient Core Capped Equity Fund was behind the benchmark, up 5.07% (gross of fees) for the month.

### **Contributors to Performance:**

The positions that contributed most to the absolute performance of the fund for the month were FirstRand Ltd (+18.31%), Capitec Bank Holdings Ltd (+23.43%), and Standard Bank Group Ltd (+17.65%).

### **Detractors from Performance:**

The largest detractors from the month's absolute performance were Naspers Ltd – N Shares (-4.32%), Gold Fields Ltd (-6.58%) and Sibanye Stillwater Ltd (-16.48%).

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## GLOSSARY

**Annualised performance:** Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

**Highest & Lowest performance:** The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

**NAV:** The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

**Current Yield:** Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

**CPU:** Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

**Alpha:** Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

**Sharpe Ratio:** The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

**Standard Deviation:** The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

**Max Drawdown:** The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

**Dividend Yield:** The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

**PE Ratio:** The weighted average price earnings ratio of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The price earnings ratio of each company is the price divided by the earnings per share.

## Fund Specific Risks

**Default Risk:** The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
