The Fund will not trade derivatives, equity or any instruments disallowed by Regulation 30.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors and South African medical aids seeking access to global bonds through a local unit trust. The Fund is compliant with Reg. 30 of the Medical Schemes Act.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

The Fund will have high exposure to offshore bonds and longer duration fixed interest securities, which may result in capital volatility over the medium term. The portfolio will be managed in such a manner to match or outperform the Bloomberg US Treasury Total Return Index after fees. The fund will allocate the majority of its capital towards offshore fixed interest securities and will therefore have 100% offshore currency risk.





FUND COMMENTARY

During November, the US government reopened following the longest shutdown in its history. Congress passed a continuing resolution that funds the government through 30 January 2026. As a result, US statistical agencies have begun publishing updated schedules for previously delayed economic data releases, with several key indicators already released. The US labour market continues to soften, and with underlying inflation trending favourably, expectations have strengthened for further interest rate cuts, including a potential cut at the December FOMC meeting.

Locally, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) unanimously decided to cut the repo rate by 25 basis points. Since September 2024, the SARB has reduced rates by a cumulative 150 basis points. The near-term inflation outlook was revised lower, with the SARB now projecting headline inflation to average 3.3% in 2025 and 3.5% in 2026. In a notable positive surprise for the market, S&P upgraded South Africa's sovereign credit rating from BB- to BB, citing an improving growth and fiscal trajectory, and maintained a positive outlook on the rating.

South African bond yields continue to react to pricing impulses driven by geopolitical developments, central bank actions, and their effects on global financial conditions.

For some emerging economies, high risk-free policy rates, combined with a strong dollar and weaker demand from advanced economies, could increase capital outflows—particularly for commodity importers facing higher commodity prices and weaker exchange rates.

These pressures could pose significant challenges, especially for borrowers with currency mismatches between their assets and liabilities, leading to a heightened "risk-off" environment.

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
